## WINDSOR UTILITIES COMMISSION ANNOUNCES WATER RATES BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2021

At Windsor Utilities Commission, our mission is to provide safe, reliable water services in a cost effective, sustainable manner. To ensure that we protect our fresh water delivery service, we continue to invest in our water distribution system.

The 2021 rates have been established to support a water system that meets provincial water quality standards and protects our supply of safe, reliable drinking water, while ensuring abundant flow to fight fires and a low rate of water main breaks.

Maintaining our aging water infrastructure will require an average annual investment of \$20 million over the next 20 years. The anticipated 2021 investment is \$29.7 million. Accordingly, the water consumption charge will increase by  $2.5 \phi$  per cubic metre, effective January 1, 2021 (from  $64.7 \phi$  cents to  $67.2 \phi$ .) The fixed monthly charge will increase  $69.0 \phi$  (from \$18.14 to \$18.83) for a 15mm meter. See the WUC website at wuc.on.ca for a full listing of Fixed Charge rates.

45% of the sum of the Fixed Charge and the Water Consumption Charge
