WINDSOR UTILITIES COMMISSION ANNOUNCES WATER RATES BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2025

At the Windsor Utilities Commission (WUC), our mission is to deliver to our customers the reliable and cost-effective water solutions that are essential to life. We continue to invest in our water production and distribution systems to ensure that we protect our fresh water delivery service.

The 2025 rates have been established to support a water system that meets provincial water quality standards and protects our supply of safe and reliable drinking water while ensuring abundant flow to fight fires and minimize water main breaks.

Maintaining our aging water infrastructure and supporting growth will require an investment of approximately \$67.3 million in 2025. Accordingly, the water consumption charge will increase by 2.9 cents per cubic metre, effective January 1, 2025 (from 75.3 cents to 78.2 cents). The fixed monthly charge will increase 80.0 cents (from \$21.06 to \$21.86) for a 15mm meter (most common for residential; rates vary based on meter size). \$0.782 per cubic metre (1 cubic metre = 1.000 litres)

(Residential, Commercial & Industrial Customers)

45% of the sum of the Fixed Charge and the Water Consumption Charge

Fixed Charge	\$ 21.86
Water Consumption (17 m³@ \$0.782)	\$ 13.29
Water Main Replacement Levy	\$ 15.82
Total Water Charges*	\$ 50.97

*Monthly bill amounts may vary based on the quantity of cubic metres of water consumed and water meter size, which determines the Fixed Charge.
