
- Northeast of Provincial Road, West of County Road 17, South of County Road 42

ABOUT FIRE HYDRANT FLOW TESTING

What is Fire Hydrant Flow Testing?

Fire hydrant flow testing is a procedure done every five years to confirm adequate water supply for firefighting. It also maintains water clarity and quality by flushing out sediment from pipes.

What Can I Expect?

During fire hydrant flow testing:

- Temporary water discolouration may occur in your neighbourhood
- · This is caused by harmless sediment in watermains being stirred up during testing
- · The water remains safe to use for drinking, cooking, and bathing

After testing is completed:

- Normal water clarity typically returns within 2-4 hours
- In rare cases, discolouration may persist up to 12 hours

What Should I Do?

During testing (while we are in your neighbourhood):

- Use only cold water for all household needs
- Postpone laundry until water runs clear

After testing concludes (crews have left your neighbourhood):

- · Flush all cold water interior faucets for 1-2 minutes until the water is clear
- · Avoid using hot water until clarity returns
